



 A general guideline would be to have a minimum of five "university-approved" credits for Maritime universities.
UNB requires six and a minimum of six for Ontario universities.

 It is an excellent idea to have at least one more acceptable credit than the minimum required.













Preparation for college

- It is important to recognize that some colleges have very <u>early admission dates</u>.
- NBCC admissions is on a first come, first serve basis and begins in April of your grade eleven year for students. (Example: If you want to attend NBCC in September 2025, you should apply this April)













Course Selection Process

- ▶ March 18 20th: Grade level presentations in the theatre.
- March 25th & 26th: Students fill out paper copies of course selection in HR
- March 27th & 28th: Students log in to their own Power School to input their course selections during Homeroom.
- ▶ April 5th: Deadline for applications for Co-op 120, Human Services 110, Personal Interest, Sports & Rec Leadership 120 and IDEA Centre.
- ► April: Homeroom schedule to give out verification sheets for parental signature. Signed verification sheets to be returned to Homeroom teacher.
- Make your choices wisely as these cannot be easily changed.

Graduation Requirements (2025)

- Successful completion of the 9/10 Program
- · Successful completion of the English Language Proficiency Assessment

Compulsory Courses: You must have the following 8 compulsory credits:

Grade 11 level

- English 11 (2 credits: Literary and Info)
- □ Financial and Workplace Mathematics 11 or Foundations of Mathematics 11 (1 credit)
- □ Science (1 credit)
- Humanities Cluster (1 credit)
- ☐ Fine Arts/Life Role Development cluster (1 credit)

Grade 12 level

□ English 12 (1 credit)

Additional credit

In Math (1 credit)

You must also have:

4 other courses at the grade '12' level

Plus 6 other courses at the 11 or 12 level

You must have a minimum of 72 credit hours (18 courses) to graduate


Graduation requirement: Math

- ➤ You NEED one grade eleven level math to be eligible to graduate (FWP or Foundations)
- ► For 2024 grads and beyond, you must pass one other Math Credit (NRF10, Financial 120).
- ▶ If you are a student who is inclined to do trades or wants to directly enter the workplace, you should do:
 - ► Financial and Workplace Mathematics 11
- ▶ If you are a student who is inclined to go to university and does well in math:
 - ► Foundations of Mathematics 11





Graduation requirement: Science



If you are a student who does well in science and math:

- ▶ Biology 112 / FI Biology 112
- Chemistry 112
- Physics 112

Very few post-secondary programs require all 3 sciences


If you are a student who finds math challenging:

- ► Human Physiology 110
- ► Intro to Environmental Science 120

Graduation requirement: Fine Arts/Life role development

Must have at least one of these credits

- ▶ Visual Arts 110/120
- ► Graphic Art & Design 110
- ► Entrepreneurship 110 (FI Entrepreneurship 110)
- Individual & Family Dynamics 120 (FI Ind & Fam Dynamics 120)
- Music 111/112/113, Music 120, Music 122
- Outdoor Education 110
- Physical Education Leadership 120
- Dramatic Arts 110/120
- Wellness through Physical Education 110
- Any Trades course (Residential Finishing, Electrical Wiring, Framing and Sheathing, Metals Fab, Mill and Cabinet, Intro to Applied Tech)
- Culinary Technology 110, 120
- Growth, Goals and Grit 120
- Co-op 120
- Nutrition and Healthy Living 120
- ► Health Care 110







- ► 50% of the course load in grade 9 and 10 must be FI designated (e.g. FI Science)
- A minimum of 5 courses with an FI designation in grades 11 and 12 must be taken (e.g., FI Modern History 112)
