Course Overview

The curriculum is structured around five key themes, integrating grammar, vocabulary, and cultural exploration. Students will build skills in speaking, listening, reading, and writing through interactive and reflective activities.

Year 1: February 2026 – June 2026

1. Identités (Identities)

- Topics: Family and relationships, personal appearance, daily routines, and food culture.
- Grammar: ER, IR, and RE verbs; adjectives; conditional tense.
- Activities:
 - Writing CVs and personal descriptions.
 - Role-playing dialogues in restaurants or social settings.
 - Projects on Francophone traditions and stereotypes.

2. Expériences (Experiences)

- Topics: Travel, celebrations, shopping, and leisure activities.
- Grammar: Imperative, passé composé, imparfait.
- Activities:
 - Virtual tours of Francophone cities.
 - Describing dream vacations.
 - Simulating shopping experiences and planning events.

3. Ingéniosité Humaine (Human Ingenuity)

- Topics: Technology, media, and entertainment.
- Grammar: Impersonal expressions, preferences, and adverbs.
- Activities:
 - Creating advertisements or news articles.
 - Debates on the impact of social media.

Year 2: February 2026 – May 2027

1. Organisation Sociale (Social Organization)

- Topics: Careers, education, and social roles.
- Grammar: Futur simple, futur proche.
- Activities:
 - Simulating interviews and writing formal letters.
 - Exploring French education and employment systems.

2. Partage de la Planète (Sharing the Planet)

- Topics: Environmental challenges, human rights, and global issues.
- Grammar: Use of pronouns "Y" and "EN"; various tenses.
- Activities:
 - Researching environmental initiatives in Francophone regions.
 - Discussing global inequalities and proposing solutions.
