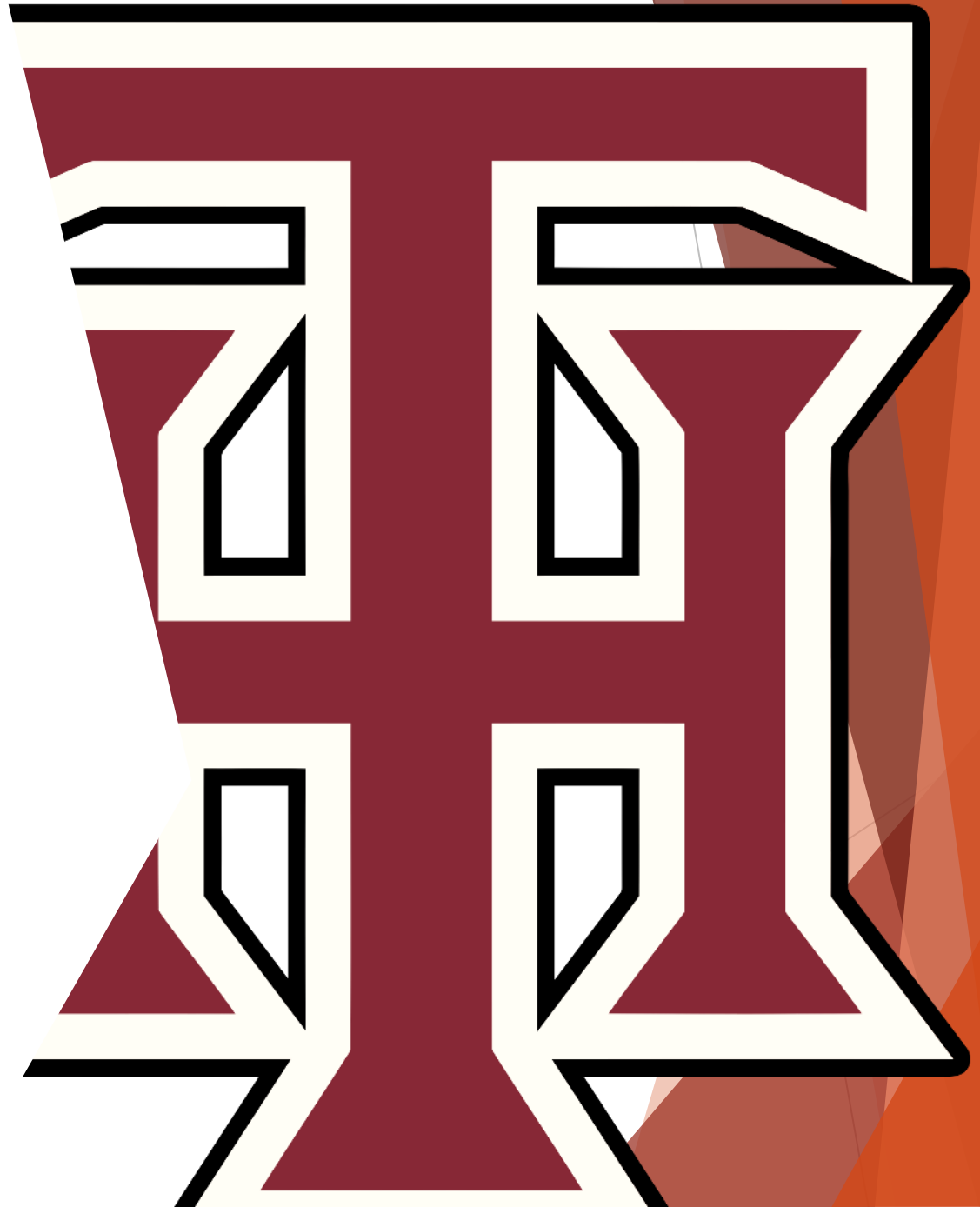

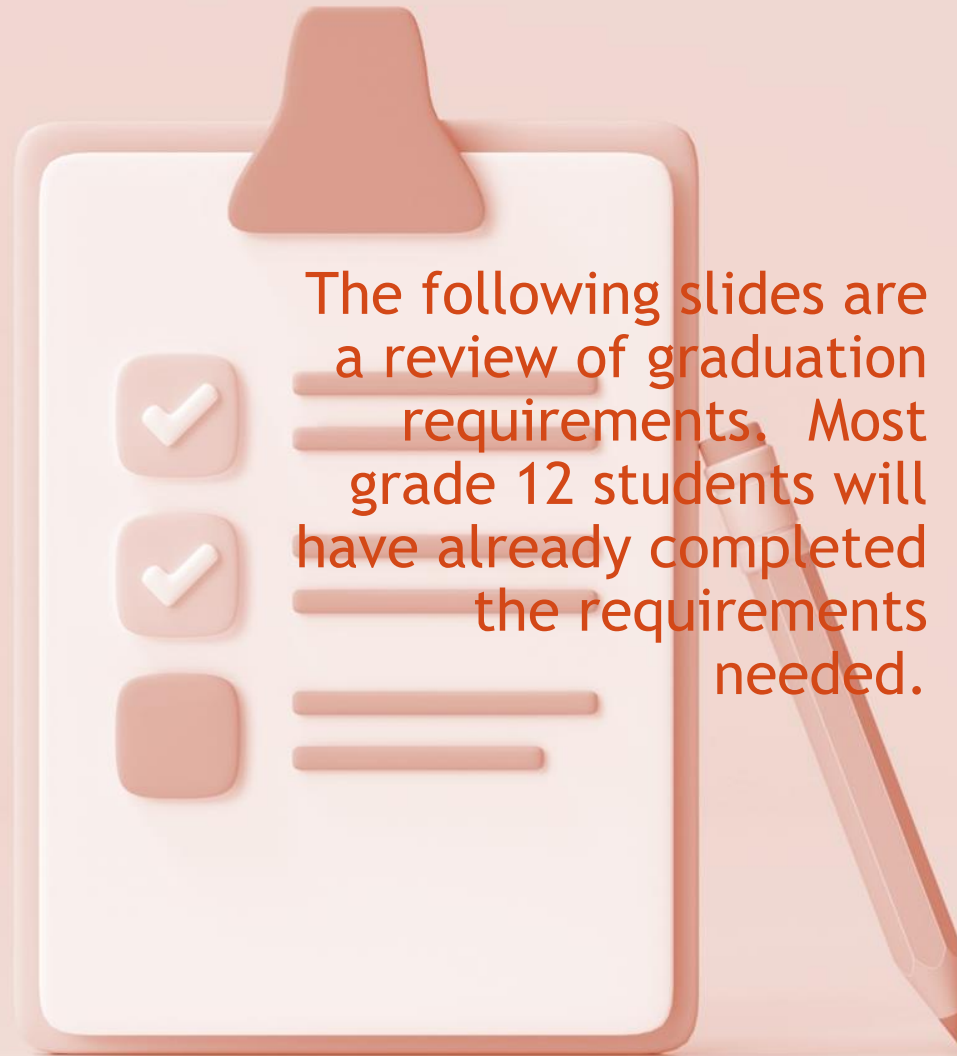

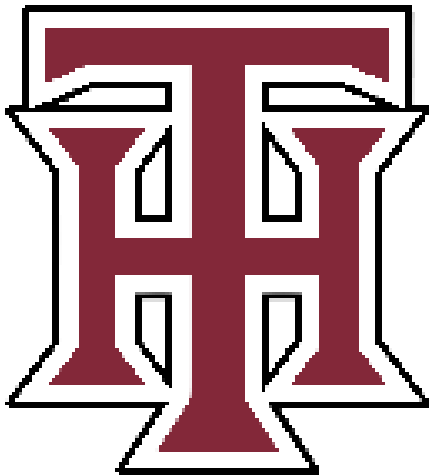

Important Notice

If you have followed the course selection pathways at HTHS, you will have flexibility for many selections in grade 12.

Some students may be looking for alternate pathways (partial day schedule, grad study period, etc) All of these options can be discussed in the fall. **Students are required to choose ten courses no matter their planned pathway.**

Experiential Learning

- ▶ Former application courses and alternates. While we are not doing applications for certain courses.
- ▶ A Committee will review your course selection to determine the appropriateness of your selections.
- ▶ For example, when you select Career Pathway Mentorship, a committee will review potential candidates

Preparation for University



- It is imperative to check with the universities of your choice.
- A general guideline would be to have a **minimum of five “university-approved” credits for Maritime universities.** UNB requires six and a minimum of six for Ontario universities.
- It is an excellent idea to have at least **one more acceptable credit** than the minimum required.

Preparation for college



- It is important to recognize that some colleges have very early admission dates.
- NBCC admissions is on a first come, first serve basis and begins in April of your grade eleven year for students. (Example: If you want to attend NBCC in September 2027, you should apply this April)
